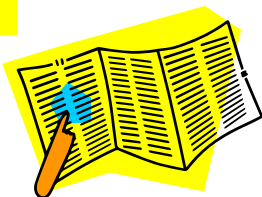

## YOU WILL RECEIVE A VOTING CARD AT HOME

The municipality will send you a voting card and a list of candidates. You will also receive a health check containing a list of questions about your health.

## CHOOSE A POLITICAL PARTY

The list of candidates will show you which parties are participating in the elections.

## GO TO THE VOTING LOCATION

On Wednesday 17 March 2021, go to the polling station with your voting card. Make sure you bring your passport, driving licence or identity card. You can vote with it if it is valid. You can also vote with it if it has expired for a maximum of 5 years.

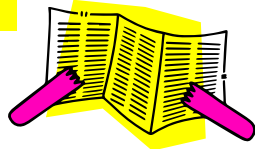

## RETURN YOUR VOTING CARD

Give your voting card to the people at the polling station. Show your passport, driving licence or identity card. The polling officials will check your card and who you are.

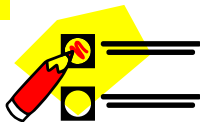

## YOU GET A BALLOT PAPER

The ballot paper lists the political parties that are participating in the elections. The people you can vote for are listed on the ballot paper, next to their political party.

## COLOUR IN 1 BOX RED

Go into a polling booth with the ballot paper. You must do this alone as no one is allowed to watch you vote. There is a red pencil in the ballot box. Find the name of the person you want to vote for on the ballot paper. Colour the box red in front of this name.

## PUT YOUR BALLOT IN THE BALLOT BOX

Fold the ballot paper and put it in the ballot box.

## YOU HAVE VOTED!

After 21:00, all votes will be counted after which the result will then be announced.

## ARE YOU 70 YEARS OR OLDER?

Then you can vote by letter. You will receive a special voting pass: A voting-plus card. The voting pass will tell you how to vote by post.

## ARE YOU IN A RISK GROUP BECAUSE OF CORONA?

Then you can also vote on Monday 15 or Tuesday 16 March. The website of your municipality will tell you which polling stations will be open on that day. Voting is the same as on Wednesday 17 March.
